

New Testament Books in Motion

In the New Testament, God reveals Himself to us in many different ways. The motions listed below reflect who God is in each book of the New Testament.

Matthew, Mark, Luke & John: God send Jesus to the Earth as a baby, dies on the cross and is raised from the dead. Teach all 4 of these books together.

When saying Matthew and Mark, put your arms together like you are rocking a baby. When you say Luke, make a cross with your arms out in front of you. When you say John, spread your hands out and above your head.

Acts: God sends his Spirit down from heaven. Put your hands up above your head and bring them down in front of you.

Romans: God's grace is revealed. This grace is a gift from God that we cannot earn. When you say Romans, hold your hands out in front of you like you are giving a gift.

1st & 2nd Corinthians: God shows himself as powerful. With your left arm, make a muscle and point to it with your right hand.

Galatians: God is our Savior, when we have faith in Him. When you say Galatians, put your hands over your eyes indicating that faith is believing in God without seeing Him.

Ephesians: God is the head of the church and unites all His people. When you say Ephesians, put your hands together with your index fingers pointing up like a church steeple.
