LEADER OVERVIEW

Today is KCRG REWIND! In the past, we have provided you a Bible Story to cover as well as participating in REWIND. We decided to try something a little different today. For your Welcome Activity, we have provided an overview of the stories we have covered over the last seven weeks. In this overview, are the answers to the REWIND questions. When you return from large group, you will have four activities to do that are activities from stories in the past seven weeks.

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KCRG REWIND Bible Story Overview

SUPPLIES: none

What To Do: Have kids sit around the tables and help retell the Bible Story Overview.

What To Say: “Does anyone know what today is? It is KCRG REWIND. We are going to take sometime to review the Bible Stories we have learned. Listen closely because the answers to the REWIND Questions are in this review.”

“We started the year learning about God creating the heavens and the earth. On the first day of creation, He created the heavens, earth, light. On the second day of creation, He created the sky to separate the water. On the third day of creation, He created land, plants with seeds, plants with fruit with seeds. On the fourth day of creation, He created the sun, moon and stars. On the fifth day of creation, He created the birds and the animals in the waters. On the sixth day of creation, He created land animals and humans. On the seventh day of creation, God rested. God created a man name Adam and a woman named Eve. They lived in the garden of Eden. God told them not to eat from the Tree of Good and Evil. That was their only rule. One day Satan came to Eve in the form of a serpent and tempted her to eat from the Tree of Good and evil telling her she would not die. Eve gave into temptation and gave the fruit to Adam to eat. When God came upon them, they hid because there were naked. God was upset with them and removed them from the Garden of Eden.

Over several generations, God was upset because of the sin and evil of people’s heart. He decided to do something about it. He chose Noah o build an ark and fill it with his family and 2 of each animal. God was going to flood the earth. He allowed it to rain for 40 days and 40 nights. The water flooded the earth for 150 days. When the water receded and Noah and his family came of the ark, God made a covenant with Noah stating there would never be another flood like that again. A covenant is a promise that can never be broken. He sealed the covenant by creating a rainbow.

Several generations passed and God called a man named Abraham to move away from his family and friends. God told him that he would make him a great nation. There would so many people in the nation that he would not be able to count them. When Abraham was 100 years old, he

had a son named Isaac. When Isaac was a a boy, God tested Abraham. He told Abraham to take his only son to Mt. Moriah and sacrifice him.

They traveled for 3 days with fire and wood. When Abraham and Isaac were at the top of the mountain, Abraham took Isaac, tied him up, and placed him on the altar. God stopped him and was pleased to see that Abraham loved God more than anything. Because of his obedience, God provided a ram for the sacrifice instead.

Isaac's son Jacob had twelve sons. He loved one son better than the other eleven. Jacob gave Joseph a robe of many colors. It showed, his brothers, that he was the favorite. His brothers were angry and jealous of him and decided to get rid of him. They took his robe, threw him in a watering hole, and then decided to sell him to slave traders. When he arrived in Egypt, he was sold to a man name Potiphar and Potiphar allowed Joseph to run his household- until his wife lied about something Joseph didn't do. Then he was thrown into prison. While there, he interpreted dreams for two men. After several years, the Pharaoh had two dreams and no one could interpret them. One of the men who had his dream interpreted in prison remembered Joseph and Joseph was called up to Pharaoh to interpret his dream. Joseph told Pharaoh that for seven years, there would be a lot of food for everyone and then for another seven years there would not be enough food for anyone. Joseph was placed in charge to ensure people would have enough food during the famine. During the famine, his brothers came to him for food. Joseph recognized them. When Joseph let them know who he was, they all rejoiced. Joseph made it possible for his family to move to Egypt.
