Think of 5 things that "belong" to something. For example, a banana, a pair of shoes, a book, a pile of paperclips, and a box of cards. Then have your family guess what these things belong to (answer: things in the trunk of my car). Whoever guesses correctly will now think of 5 things for the family. With little kids, you can just ask them outright for a list of things in a category (for example, name three things in your bed), and the first to list the 3 things will win. 430-9364

Find the Hearts

Before playing, cut five heart shapes from construction paper. Write the following words on each

shape: heart, soul, mind, strength, neighbor. Write one word per heart shape. Gather a Bible and place the hearts inside the Bible at Matthew 22, Matthew 26, Mark 14, Matthew 25, and Deuteronomy 18. Invite kids to open the Bible and search for the hearts. After all the hearts have been found, read the word written on each heart aloud. Talk about ways kids can show love to God, such as learning about the Bible, praying, singing, and coming to church. Ask kids to tell ways they can show love to people in their lives.

SAY: We found heart shapes inside the various books of the Bible. All of our stories this month come from these chapters. What do you think of when you see a heart shape? I think of love. The religious leaders asked Jesus what the most important commandment was. Jesus said, 'Love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength.' He then added, 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' Jesus was teaching that the most important command is to love God and love people.

Deuteronomy 18:15 (ESV)
