



Give kids different scenarios with the opportunities to decide between what they want and what is best. Jump up for what you want, squat down for what is best. Examples: Cookies vs. vegetables; Staying up late vs. going to bed on time; Doing homework early vs. waiting until the last minute to get it done; Watching a movie they're not allowed to watch vs. turning off the movie; Cleaning your room when asked vs. deciding to watch TV instead; Keeping money you found on the floor at a store vs. turning in the money to an employee at the store.

Say: Because of our sin, we are all wired with the desire to choose our own way instead of what is best—God's way. This was true of Adam and Eve in the Garden in Eden, it was true of God's people wanting a king in our story, and it is true of us also. Sometimes what is best for us isn't what we think it is. God knows what is best for us and we can always trust Him.





FAMILY FEUD MINI EDITION

One player becomes the host and secretly writes a category with five answers (for example, "Things in a refrigerator"). The other players take turns around the table, each trying to guess as many of the five answers as they can before 60 seconds are up, earning one point per correct guess. After everyone has had a turn, the player with the most points wins the round. The winner becomes the next host and gets to choose the new category and write the next five answers.





ROMANS 6:23

"For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord."

As a family, take time in January and February to pray together, thanking God for the families who received gifts from North Metro Church at the Christmas Market and in Guatemala. Ask Him to bless those families and guide them in the new year. Then, pray as a family about your own New Year's resolutions, seeking God's guidance in areas like spiritual life, family relationships, health, education, sports, and finances, write a few down—like 'I will spend 10 minutes with God every morning' or 'I will run a mile once a week'—and do your best to hold each other accountable as you follow through on them.



The Israelites made it to the promised land! Everything was going to be great now, right? Wrong! Sometimes we think that when we get to a specific place or accomplish a certain goal, everything will be easy-peasy. That might be what the Israelites thought. God's people were finally in the promised land, but not all was well. Generation after generation continued a pattern of disobedience—a cycle of sin with troubling consequences. Because God is just and holy, He would never allow His people's sin to go unchecked. But because He is also loving and gracious, He would always provide forgiveness of sin through repentance.

When God's people wanted a king just so they could be like the nations around them, God warned them but gave them what they wanted. King Saul seemed like the ideal king, but he proved not to be the king the people needed. When Saul sinned against God, God judged him and promised to remove him as king.
