

Daniel's Main Points:

Joshua 4:1-7, 19-24, Luke 22:7-8, 14-20

Responses to unanswered prayers:

- 1.Throw a fit
- 2.Play the Blame Game
- 3.Remember

Remember who God is and what He has done.

What can you do REMEMBER who God is and what He has done?

Discussion Questions:

What prompts do you use most often to give you reminders? (Examples: post-it notes, alarm clock, calendar, phone apps, signs, etc)

What most challenged or inspired you from Sunday's message?

Read Joshua 4:1-9.

Why was it important for Israel to remember this moment? (See Joshua 4:24)?
God used stones as both a reminder of His faithfulness and to inspire future obedience. What people, places, or events has God used to remind you of His faithfulness?
Who or what has God used to prompt you toward obedience?
Read Judges 2:8-11. What does this passage say about the generations after Joshua died?
One commentator said: "The first generation believed it, the second generation assumed it; third generation forgot it."
What are some helpful reminders we can setup today to inspire future obedience in our life and future generations?
What can you do to remember who God is and what He has done?
Who do you need to pass your story on to?
Looking back at this week's teaching and study, is there one thing you'd especially like to remember this week?
