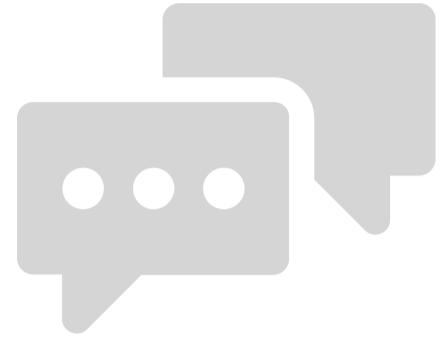

Discussion Questions

As we close out this series, we are taking this last Sunday to have a panel of teachers answer a few questions that we were asked. The following questions will be the rundown of questions that we hope to cover in our time.

As a group, talk through the questions below and share what you learned from the answers from the panel.

1. Which book in the Bible is the most important to read?
2. How did Jesus dying on the cross take away sins? What would have happened if Jesus never sacrificed himself?
3. What happened to Jesus after he was resurrected? Where did he go?
4. Can you still be a good Christian without abiding to every aspect of the Bible? Say premarital sex or drunkenness?
5. Once you are saved, are you always saved? Can you lose your salvation after doubting or denying God?
6. Why are some commandments in the Bible still followed and some are not? What do we keep from the Old Testament? And why does it seem that God is so different from the Old Testament to New Testament?

7. How do intellectually disabled people who cannot understand the Gospel fit into God's plan?
8. What actually is the, "Trinity?!" Explain it to me like a 5th grader, please.
9. When will the rapture happen? Let's get into Revelation because it is feeling close!
10. Can God forgive you of your sins even if you don't forgive yourself?
